

MUD VOLLEYBALL VS EPILEPSY

WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO?!

Your participation in the 34th Annual Mud Volleyball Tournament allows us to continue to offer the following programs and services to people with epilepsy and their families:

- Camp Courage: An overnight camping experience for 30 children and teens that have epilepsy
- 5 Support Groups throughout Connecticut
- Seizure training for police and first responders
- Epilepsy Education programs tailored to teachers, school nurses, transit companies, workplaces, seniors, and other health agencies
- Information & Referral for newly diagnosed clients and families
- Webinar series providing accurate information about a variety of epilepsy topics
- Advocacy Day at the Connecticut State Capitol
- Transportation assistance for clients with epilepsy
- Teens Speak Up Program: A selected teen and their family travels to DC to meet other teens from around the country and speak with federal legislators to advocate for people with epilepsy
- Client Telephone Networks that connect people with epilepsy
- HOBSCOTCH Memory & Cognition Program
- Project Uplift: Mental health program for people with epilepsy
